JESUS MAKES FISHERS OF MEN

This lesson on Jesus' call to his first disciples (Peter, James, and John) is a message for all of us. "Follow me!" has lots of great meanings for us, and this lesson will reveal quite a few.

SCRIPTURE & LESSON

PASSAGE (NIV): MATTHEW 4:18-22 & LUKE 5:2-11

Read the following excerpts as shown (NIV translation), or read from your chosen Bible translation:



Matthew 4:18-22

¹⁸ As Jesus was walking beside the Sea of Galilee, he saw two brothers, Simon called Peter and his brother Andrew. They were casting a net into the lake, for they were fishermen. ¹⁹ "Come, follow me," Jesus said, "and I will send you out to fish for people." ²⁰ At once they left their nets and followed him.

²¹ Going on from there, he saw two other brothers, James son of Zebedee and his brother John. They were in a boat with their father Zebedee, preparing their nets. Jesus called them, ²² and immediately they left the boat and their father and followed him.

Luke 5:2-11 (this is the same story but with more details)

² He saw at the water's edge two boats, left there by the fishermen, who were washing their nets. ³ He got into one of the boats, the one belonging to Simon, and asked him to put out a little from shore. Then he sat down and taught the people from the boat.

⁴ When he had finished speaking, he said to Simon, "Put out into deep water, and let down the nets for a catch."

⁵ Simon answered, "Master, we've worked hard all night and haven't caught anything. But because you say so, I will let down the nets."

⁶ When they had done so, they caught such a large number of fish that their nets began to break. ⁷ So they signaled their partners in the other boat to come and help them, and they came and filled both boats so full that they began to sink.

⁸ When Simon Peter saw this, he fell at Jesus' knees and said, "Go away from me, Lord; I am a sinful man!" ⁹ For he and all his companions were astonished at the catch of fish they had taken, ¹⁰ and so were James and John, the sons of Zebedee, Simon's partners.

Then Jesus said to Simon, "Don't be afraid; from now on you will fish for people." $^{\rm 11}$ So they pulled their boats up on shore, left everything and followed him.

Questions for Children

- 1. This often happens in the Bible. A story in one book will give slightly different details than the same story in another book. Both accounts are true. It just gives us a chance to see the same story from two different sets of eyes and ears. Which story caught your attention more, and why?
- 2. The first story sounds a little abrupt. It's just a recounting of the most basic facts for a historical record. In the second, we get some great details, like Simon Peter falling on his knees before the Lord and confessing that he is sinful. Have you ever felt afraid to pray or felt anxious about praying because you didn't feel good enough? Describe that feeling. How did the Lord feel about Simon Peter? He wasn't worried about Simon Peter's bad behaviors. He knew what Simon Peter could be made into.
- 3. Jesus said in both accounts, "From now on, you will fish for people." What does this message mean? They would bring people to Christ instead of bringing fish into a boat. How does this message apply to us today? We are supposed to be showing the love of Christ daily.



TEACHER'S MIGHTY MESSAGE

Have you ever been in a large crowd of kids and felt like you didn't matter? Do you feel sometimes that everyone is getting the attention but you? Have you ever felt unworthy, unimportant, or like your life is invisible to others, and they couldn't care less about you?

If so, you are very much like Jesus' disciples. The people he called were not kings, queens, high priests from the temple, or the rich and famous. His first call was to fishermen, guys who got dirty and sweaty in their jobs. And they confessed to being far from perfect.

Try to picture these men at your age, if they had been schoolchildren. They weren't the straight-A students, or the best dressed, though they probably tried hard to earn those B's. They did some things right, and at times they messed up. Their parents were respectable and hardworking, but they were in jobs of service to others, like catching their food.

These men had met Jesus before. It's often a problem when seeing that first story from Matthew, because it seems not to make sense. These men weren't "struck by lightning" to make the decision to follow him immediately. They had been waiting for it. James' younger brother John and Simon Peter's younger brother Andrew had been disciples of John the Baptist before switching over to Jesus. They met Jesus at his baptism and spent the following day with him (John 1:35-42).

Today, we wait for Jesus' return, like the disciples waited to be called. Today, we can feel the same level of excitement, because Jesus is saying to us also, "Follow me!" He is saying it in this room, this morning. He speaks to hearts that are open and ears that are ready to listen. "Follow me" will have a slightly different meaning for each of us.

Let's be ready to listen to Jesus in our hearts and do what he says in order to "follow him!"






PRINTABLE CRAFT

FISHERS OF MEN LACING CRAFT



MATERIALS:

- Fishers of Men Printable File (one page)
- White Paper or Cardstock
- Coloring Utensils
- Scissors
- Glue
- Yarn (about 16 feet per student)



PREPARATION:

· Print one copy of Fishers of Men Printable Craft for each student

INSTRUCTIONS:

- 1. Color images as desired
- 2. Carefully cut out fish shapes
- 3. Using a hole punch, punch out holes along guide lines on seascape scene.
- 4. Glue fish to sea scape scene
- 5. With yarn, lace craft to create a net:
 - 1. To begin, start in the bottom row on the left side, and lace yarn through the hole from the back, being sure to leave a small tail of about six to eight inches. Then lace yarn into the hole directly above in the top row. Lace yarn through the bottom hole, just to the right of the starting point, and follow this same pattern of going from bottom to top until you end with the yarn on the back side in the upper right corner.
 - 2. Lace the yarn through the hole on top hole of the vertical lines on the right side (diagonal to your prior end point). The yarn should not be on the front side of the craft. Weave the yarn back and forth through the vertical lines already laced, then push the yarn through the hole on the left side, directly opposite so the yarn is again on the back side. Take the yarn and lace through the hole on the right side, underneath the prior hole. Then once again, weave yarn through vertical lines and lace through the opposite hold on the left side. Continue this pattern until you get to the last row.
 - 3. Turn the craft over and tie the yarn end with the small tail left from the beginning.






































GAME

FISH FOR BIBLE VERSES

This game uses a stick, a string, and a clothespin for a fishing rod. Your students will fish for Bible verses until they get matches that will teach them about discipleship.



MATERIALS:

- 2 Copies of Discipleship Fish File (follows)
- Scissors
- Tape
- Clothespin (the kind with the spring that snaps shut and you pinch to open it)
- Yardstick

Objective:

Collect the first set of matching verses.



PREPARATION:


- 1. Create a fishing pole by taping one end of a three-foot string to the end of a yardstick and the other end to one side of the clothespin.
- 2. Create two copies of the Discipleship Fish File and cut out all the fish, then fold them in half. Place them all in the basket.
- 3. Place the basket behind a student chair (and the students will stand in front of it to cast their line).


INTRODUCTION

Jesus told his disciples to follow him, and they would fish for people from then on. If we want to be like the disciples, a great way to start is by knowing our Bibles. Today we will be fishing for Bible verses on how to be a good disciple.

Instructions:

- 1. Have students take turns holding the fishing pole in front of the chair, over the basket behind the chair. See which piece of paper the pin touches first and attach it to the line. The student should reel the line in, read the verse aloud, and keep it.
- 2. Repeat until all students have had at least one turn.
- 3. The first student to get a match wins. If the match happens early on, keep playing for second- and third-place winners.
- 4. If no students have a match after all the cards have been picked up, have them put all back except for one of their choosing. Make sure that two students are not keeping a copy of the same verse so that a match cannot happen. Then repeat until a match comes up. The person with the match wins.
- 5. Let students decide which verses mean the most to them and allow them to take a couple home.
