A favorite parable of Jesus is that of building your house on the rock and not the sand. It will teach children that building your life on faith in Christ means you won't fall apart when life gets stormy.

**EXCERPTS FROM MATTHEW 7 (NIV)** 

Read the following excerpts as shown (NIV translation), or read from your chosen Bible translation:



#### MATTHEW 7:24-27

- <sup>24</sup> "Therefore everyone who hears these words of mine and puts them into practice is like a wise man who built his house on the rock.
- <sup>25</sup> The rain came down, the streams rose, and the winds blew and beat against that house; yet it did not fall, because it had its foundation on the rock.
- <sup>26</sup> But everyone who hears these words of mine and does not put them into practice is like a foolish man who built his house on sand.
- <sup>27</sup> The rain came down, the streams rose, and the winds blew and beat against that house, and it fell with a great crash."

#### **Questions for Children about The House Upon the Rocks:**

- 1. What does Jesus say is like "building a house on a rock?" A: Hearing what he has to say and putting those words into practice. A foundation means two things: it means the strong part under a house that keeps it together. It also can mean having a good background, such as a good foundation of learning your faith. What are the things that go into having a good foundation to your faith, that help you learn and understand the things Jesus said? **A: coming to Sunday school and youth group, reading your Bible regularly, praying and seeking his voice.**
- 2. Jesus talks here about a big storm. What is the difference between the houses built on the rock and the sand, once the storm comes? A: The house on the sand can't withstand the storm, but the house on the rock does. We often have "stormy times" in our lives. How does having a good foundation in Christ help us weather those stormy times without falling apart? Our faith makes us remember that God is in charge. Our faith helps us trust him for a good outcome and for the steps back to peace. Our belief in God's love helps us look for sense in things that don't make sense.
- 3. Think of a time in your life you would consider "stormy," meaning bad things were happening. Did your faith help you? If so, how? Do you feel, looking back, that more faith would have helped you? If so, what would it have done?



#### **TEACHER'S MIGHTY MESSAGE**

One thing we can count on in this world is that nobody's life will be perfect. 'Storms' come along for us to weather. The good news is that Jesus says, "In this world you will have tribulation. But be of good cheer. I have overcome the world."

He is talking about two things: First, that we always have heaven to look forward to where we can live with him forever. Second, that here on earth, where there are 'storms,' he will help us through and make us stronger.

Singers have a great expression: "You've got to pay your dues to sing the blues." This means that times of sorrow, or 'storms,' make you a better singer. We believe that 'storms' can make us better people.

As we go through our lives, we want to build our hearts and our minds on Jesus. We want to remember his words, be filled with his spirit, speak to him every day—whether we're in school or out playing or with our families.

If we make him a regular part of our lives and invite him to be part of everything we do, it's like building our house on the rock.





# **EDIBLE CRAFT**

#### HOUSE UPON THE ROCK SNACK

This is a fun snack/craft combo that kids will LOVE. They get to make their own "House Upon the Rock" to eat as a snack.









# **MATERIALS**:

- Rice Cakes
- Larger Marshmallows
- Hershey's Kisses
- Cookie Icing

Note: The same edible craft can be created with rice cakes, hummus, and veggies if you are looking for a healthier spin on the same idea.

# **INSTRUCTIONS:**

The rice cakes will make the "rock". One marshmallow and a Hershey's kiss will make the "house". You can use the ricing as the glue to hold the roof on the house and the house on the rock.



# **GAME**

# **BLOWIN' IN THE WIND**

In this game, students will be the wind and rain of a stormy time. They will try to get the parts of the scripture of the House on the Rock parable into a line—by blowing on scraps of paper! You can then discuss how God works in stormy times when all might seem lost.



# **MATERIALS**:

- House on the Rock Squares (follows the instructions)
- Clear playing area on the learning table
- Scissors



# PREPARATION:

Print out and cut out two sets of the Rock Squares.

### INTRODUCTION

We all have storms in our lives. And yet God helps us through them. Let's be a little bit of a storm ourselves right now and try to demonstrate how God still works when our foundation is in Christ.



# **INSTRUCTIONS:**

- 1. Divide the class into two teams.
- 2. Give each team a set of the scripture passage cut into six squares
- 3. Have them shuffle the squares and then lay them in a row in random order on the table. They should not be in their proper order.
- 4. When you say, "Go!" both teams will become a storm "wind" and try to blow the squares into their proper order in a row. They can take turns or figure out how to work together.
- 5. If a verse falls off the table, they have to put it back on at the edge of where it fell.
- 6. The first team to get the scripture in order wins.

#### CONCLUSION:

When life gets "stormy" and things start going wrong, it can look like chaos, can't it? It will look like things can never come together in peace and sunshine again.

The wind we were making by blowing was a little like life when things get stormy. But our hearts were like God and the Holy Spirit. We wanted to put the truth in order when things go wrong. Just like we helped with our knowledge, God helps in a storm.

The stronger our foundation in Christ, the more likely we are to weather the storms of life well.



#### This Week We Learned About ...

#### ✓ Questions for Kids:

- 1. What does it mean to build your house on the sand? To have a careless attitude about faith, which will catch up with you in tough times.
- 2. What does it mean to build on the rock? To live a life rooted in God so that your faith won't crumble in tough times.
- 3. What do you think the rain symbolizes? Tough times. You can see the results of houses built on sand when people say things like, "I stopped believing when my loved one died. I can't understand how God could be so cruel."

#### ✓ Dinner Table Discussion:

Think of something that could happen that would threaten some people's faith. Discuss with your family. Think of scriptures or experiences you've had that would prevent you from being "washed away" by it.

Do you have a story about how a memory verse or story from the bible helped you do the right thing? Tell the story and discuss.




