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JESUS HEALS A PARALYZED MAN MIGHTY MESSAGE

The story of Jesus healing a paralytic who was lowered through the roof is a great tale of both healing and forgiveness. It will teach children that persistence wins, courage is great, and we can all be forgiven through Christ. Jesus not only stopped in the middle of a speech to commend the friends of the paralyzed man, but he proved a point to the naysayers with his statement, "Your sins are forgiven." Who can forgive sins? Obviously, Jesus has the power to forgive, as was proven by his next words, "Which is easier, to forgive sins or to say rise up and walk?" The man arose!

SCRIPTURE & LESSON

EXCERPTS FROM MARK 2 (NIV)

Read the following excerpts as shown (NIV translation), or read from your chosen Bible translation:



MARK 2:1-12

¹A few days later, when Jesus again entered Capernaum, the people heard that he had come home. ² They gathered in such large numbers that there was no room left, not even outside the door, and he preached the word to them. ³ Some men came, bringing to him a paralyzed man, carried by four of them. ⁴ Since they could not get him to Jesus because of the crowd, they made an opening in the roof above Jesus by digging through it and then lowered the mat the man was lying on. ⁵ When Jesus saw their faith, he said to the paralyzed man, "Son, your sins are forgiven."

⁶ Now some teachers of the law were sitting there, thinking to themselves, ⁷ "Why does this fellow talk like that? He's blaspheming! Who can forgive sins but God alone?"

⁸ Immediately Jesus knew in his spirit that this was what they were thinking in their hearts, and he said to them, "Why are you thinking these things? ⁹ Which is easier: to say to this paralyzed man, 'Your sins are forgiven,' or to say, 'Get up, take your mat and walk'? ¹⁰ But I want you to know that the Son of Man has authority on earth to forgive sins." So he said to the man, ¹¹ "I tell you, get up, take your mat and go home." ¹² He got up, took his mat and walked out in full view of them all. This amazed everyone and they praised God, saying, "We have never seen anything like this!"

Questions for Children about Jesus Healing a Paralyzed Man:

- 1. How did the paralyzed man's four friends get him in front of Jesus? *A: they dug a hole in the roof and lowered him down.* Do you think Jesus found this distracting from what he was trying to say? Do you think others found it distracting? *A: That may be our initial thought. Jesus always had unusual ways of looking at things. Instead of seeing an annoyance, he saw faith in God at work in them.*
- 2. Which is more important—to have your sins forgiven or be healed of a sickness? Why? A: Sickness is to the body, but sin is to the soul. It causes hurt in relationships, whereas sickness generally doesn't. Therefore, forgiveness is more important.
- 3. Does Jesus enjoy forgiving our sins? Why? A: Like parents, Jesus is overjoyed when one of his children realizes they're making a lot of mistakes and wants to change. He is more than willing to help.
- 4. Have you ever been afraid to tell Jesus something that you did wrong for fear he wouldn't want to speak to you? What do you think of that reasoning now? *It's* important to tell Jesus whatever is on your mind, especially if it's guilt. He forgives and forgets.



TEACHER'S MIGHTY MESSAGE

If you make mistakes and say, "Wow, I'm sorry," to your parents, they are so relieved! Granted, some parents who suffer from high anxiety may want to preach at a child after an apology. But Jesus just wants to know you are sorry. He knows what apologies are and what they really do as far as forgiving sins.

Some people think apologies or asking another's forgiveness are just good manners. Apologies are so much more. They allow the other person to know that you are aware that you hurt them. An apology means you will try not to do it again. How can people trust you if they are going around saying, "Does he even care that he hurt me so badly?" Saying "sorry" helps bring back trust.


When we say "sorry" to Jesus he will feel relieved, not disgusted or mad! And he will reach out in trust again! He will heal us from the powers of sin, which can be just as bad as the physical paralysis that the man had. So we need to go to Jesus boldly with our problems and our confessions. We need to always think of the paralyzed man and his four friends!

Paste the components onto the colored Background Page over the dotted outline, using the Mock-Up Page for guidance.







Suggestions for Making this Craft a Success with Younger Kids:

GAME

RISE UP & WALK

This hilarious game is a sleepover favorite but can also be used in youth ministries to make a point about hoping in God. Requiring students to carry "paraplegics" around, it will also wear them out, so they can sit and listen later!





OBJECTIVE:

To be the first team to reach the "Place of Forgiven Sins" for the third time.

INTRODUCTION

We all heard Jesus say, in today's lesson from Mark 2, "Your sins are forgiven" and "Rise up and walk." The object of the game is for your team to race to the Place of Forgiven Sins three times. (That's because there are three of you, and each of you has sins.) But to race with a paraplegic, you have to make a special means of carrying him! Let's see how well you can do to get all your sins erased!



INSTRUCTIONS:

- 1. Form teams of three students each. If you have fewer than six students, they can play the game in several rounds, trying to beat their own time. In that case, engage your assistant with a smartphone stopwatch. Have teams line up on one end of the room. The other wall is "Forgiven Sins."
- 2. Have two students make a "cross-arm chair" by taking hold of each other's wrists, so that the left hands are gripping left wrists and right hands are gripping right wrists. Have the "paraplegic" on the team sit on the "X" made by their forearms.
- 3. When you say, "Go!" Teams will carry the paraplegic to and from the wall three times. They must slap the wall and come all the way back to the starting line twice before proceeding to the place of Forgiven Sins for the final time.
- 4. At any point during their struggle, you may shout, "Your sins are forgiven! Rise up and walk!" At that time, the paraplegic may jump down. All three teammates can finish the race running.
- 5. The first team to reach the Place of Forgiven Sins for the third time wins.
- 6. To lengthen the game, repeat the race twice so that all teammates get a turn to be the paraplegic.





This Week We Learned About ...

Jesus not only stopped in the middle of a speech to commend the friends of the paralyzed man, but he proved a point to the nay-sayers with his statement, "Your sins are forgiven."

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✓ Questions for Kids:

- 1. What did Jesus say that upset the Pharisees? "Your sins are forgiven."
- 2. Why were they upset that he said that? **Because they believed only God could forgive sins.**
- 3. How do we know from this that Jesus has the power to forgive sins? *Because he told the paralytic to rise up and walk.*

✓ Dinner Table Discussion:

The men were desperate to get their friend in front of Jesus so he could be healed. Is there anything in your life you wish Jesus could fix? Discuss it with your family.

Bringing our needs to Jesus through prayer can produce great results. Make a list together of some things you would like to pray for. As you write down each one discuss why that particular thing is important to you and how you want God to help.

CHEAT SHEET: ALL ABOUT JESUS (& HIS MIRACLES)

- Jesus is not known to have performed any miracles as a child. He did not stand out as a child but behaved normally. Some extra-Biblical material cites Jesus performing miracles in childhood, but the Christian community generally doesn't believe them.
- Jesus' first recorded miracle is in John 2, when he changed water into wine at a wedding in Cana. It occurred after his baptism, but before he was tempted by Satan in the wilderness.
- Jesus' last miracle before his death was restoring the ear of the high priest's servant Malchus at his arrest, after Simon Peter cut it off. It is recorded in John 18 and Luke 22.
- There are 37 miracles performed by Jesus recorded in the four gospels. These do not include his Resurrection, which he was not considered to have taken part in (as he was dead). They also don't include events like the Transfiguration (where Jesus saw Moses and Elijah) or the Ascension, which are considered God performing the miracle on or toward Jesus.
- Jesus did many more miracles than what is recorded in the bible. Apostle John ended his gospel with this saying in John 21:25: Jesus did many other things as well. If every one of them were written down, I suppose that even the whole world would not have room for the books that would be written.



Here is a complete list of the types of recorded miracles completed by Jesus during his three-year ministry. In some he healed multiple people, up to several hundred. Others are single healings.




