JESUS MEETS THE CHILDREN MIGHTY MESSAGE

A number of gospel passages mention Jesus greeting children and teaching about them. This lesson combines four passages about children and will teach kids that God is completely interested in them and finds them special. Jesus's disciples tried to keep the children away, thinking the Lord was too busy. But Jesus told them to let the children come!

SCRIPTURE & LESSON

EXCERPTS FROM MATTHEW & MARK (NIV)

Read the following excerpts as shown (NIV translation), or read from your chosen Bible translation:



MATTHEW 18:2-5

- ² He called a little child to him, and placed the child among them.
- ³ And he said: "Truly I tell you, unless you change and become like little children, you will never enter the kingdom of heaven.
- ⁴ Therefore, whoever takes the lowly position of this child is the greatest in the kingdom of heaven.
- ⁵ And whoever welcomes one such child in my name welcomes me.



MATTHEW 18:10-14

- ¹⁰ "See that you do not despise one of these little ones, for I say to you that their angels in heaven continually see the face of My Father who is in heaven. [11 For the Son of Man came to seek and to save the lost."]
- ¹²"What do you think? If a man owns a hundred sheep, and one of them wanders away, will he not leave the ninety-nine on the hills and go to look for the one that wandered off?
- ¹³And if he finds it, truly I tell you, he is happier about that one sheep than about the ninety-nine that did not wander off.
- ¹⁴In the same way your Father in heaven is not willing that any of these little ones should perish.



MARK 9:36-37

- ³⁶ He took a little child whom he placed among them. Taking the child in his arms, he said to them,
- ³⁷ "Whoever welcomes one of these little children in my name welcomes me; and whoever welcomes me does not welcome me but the one who sent me."

MARK 10:13-16

- ¹³ People were bringing little children to Jesus for him to place his hands on them, but the disciples rebuked them.
- When Jesus saw this, he was indignant. He said to them, "Let the little children come to me, and do not hinder them, for the kingdom of God belongs to such as these.
- ¹⁵ Truly I tell you, anyone who will not receive the kingdom of God like a little child will never enter it."
- ¹⁶ And he took the children in his arms, placed his hands on them and blessed them.

Questions for Children about the Birth of Jesus:

- 1. Jesus said in the first passage that adults must become like you to enter the kingdom of heaven. There is a lot to be said for adult wisdom. Jesus also teaches obedience to parents. But what's special about children that God would want adults to imitate them? A: Children have more faith or easier faith. They submit to authority and parents, like adults need to submit to Christ's will. Children forgive more easily and don't nurse grudges as easily.
- 2. Jesus makes a remarkable claim in Matthew 18:10. What is it? A: I say to you that their angels in heaven continually see the face of My Father who is in heaven. Angels surrounding you are constantly seeing both you and God. What does that tell you about God hearing your prayers? What does that tell you about God understanding your needs?
- 3. Look at the parable of the lost sheep that follows in Matthew 18. What does it say? A: If a man owns a hundred sheep, and one of them wanders away, will he not leave the ninety-nine on the hills and go to look for the one that wandered off? ¹³And if he finds it, truly I tell you, he is happier about that one sheep than about the ninety-nine that did not wander off. Any of us can get into sinful habits or sinful periods of our lives. Should we be afraid to approach God if this happens to us? Why or why not?



TEACHER'S MIGHTY MESSAGE

You will hear your favorite adults at home and in Sunday school say until the Second Coming: God is always watching and hears all your prayers. You will hear adults say that children are very special to him, and they'll give a dozen different reasons why.

So, then, why doesn't he answer more prayers "Yes?" Each year as we grow, we see that our list of prayers answered "No" or "not answered at all" grows longer. Why is that?

Once our lives are transformed by Christ, we have a marvelous opportunity to grow in him. We listen to what the Holy Spirit tells our hearts. We listen to what Christ said in the Bible. One thing he said consistently is that happiness doesn't come from getting. It comes from giving. Our lives should become more and more about giving as we grow.

When we are tied into the Holy Spirit and God's will daily, we become less likely to pray for things like "God, help my team win!" (A loving heart would also think of the people on the other team, some of whom probably prayed "make my team win!")

As your prayers become less self-centered and more Christ-centered, the less likely you are to pray for things out of his will. You will get more yesses—and you will find that ironically, you will be truly happy.

- Coloring utensils (optional)

- 2. Optional: If printing the black and white template, color as desired.

1. Print the Love Bear templates on white paper or card

- 7. Slide the heart onto the arm as shown.






























GAME

SHOWING LOVE TO FRIENDS

INTRODUCTION

Those children in the Bible sure were fortunate—to get to meet Jesus, get a hug, or even sit on his lap! Yet he is today just as close to us as he was to them. He wants us to share his love with others. One of the best says to show love is by showing an interest in others. Really LISTEN to them. Let's play a game where interest shows love and love listens.



- 1. Match students up in pairs.
- 2. Have one student in each pair tell his partner five facts about himself in 60 seconds. They can include birth date, street address, ancestry, favorite dish, favorite movie, favorite snack—anything the teller wants to reveal. The other must show interest by listening carefully.
- 3. After 60 seconds, stop the first student from telling more.
- 4. Have the listeners go around and take turns to see who can repeat all five facts. Remind the listeners to keep thinking of the facts in their heads when other listeners go before them!
- 5. Give a candy prize to the student who can remember all the facts.
- 6. Switch partners and repeat as many times as you wish.







This Week We Learned About ...

Four passages about children were presented to teach the children that God is completely interested in them and finds them special. Jesus's disciples tried to keep children away, thinking the Lord was too busy. But Jesus told them to let the children come!



✓ Questions for Kids:

- 1. Why do you think the disciples rebuked the people for bringing Jesus their children? *They thought he was too busy/important for children*
- 2. How did Jesus react? *He grew indignant and said "Let them come to me!"*
- 3. What does this tell you about how Jesus feels about children? *He loves them and sees them as special.*

✓ Dinner Table Discussion:

In Jesus' day certain people were seen as important while others were not. Jesus clearly didn't see it the same way. Can you think of people in modern times who are seen as unimportant? How do you think we should treat them?

The bible says not to let anyone judge you because you are young. Discuss some ways kids can serve God in their daily lives in spite of their young ages.




