JESUS WALKS ON WATER MIGHTY MESSAGE

The story of Jesus calming the winds and telling the disciple Peter to walk on water with him will teach children in Sunday school or youth ministry that God is in control—even in the storms of life. Peter wanted badly to walk on water to Jesus, but like most of us, he became overwhelmed by the circumstances and needed a better vision of God's plan.

SCRIPTURE & LESSON

EXCERPTS FROM MATTHEW 14:22-33

Read the following excerpts as shown (NIV translation), or read from your chosen Bible translation:



MATTHEW 14:22-33

²² Immediately Jesus made the disciples get into the boat and go on ahead of him to the other side, while he dismissed the crowd.

²³ After he had dismissed them, he went up on a mountainside by himself to pray. Later that night, he was there alone,

²⁴ and the boat was already a considerable distance from land, buffeted by the waves because the wind was against it.

²⁵ Shortly before dawn Jesus went out to them, walking on the lake.

²⁶ When the disciples saw him walking on the lake, they were terrified. "It's a ghost," they said, and cried out in fear.

²⁷ But Jesus immediately said to them: "Take courage! It is I. Don't be afraid."
²⁸ "Lord, if it's you," Peter replied, "tell me to come to you on the water."
²⁹ "Come," he said.

Then Peter got down out of the boat, walked on the water and came toward Jesus.

³⁰ But when he saw the wind, he was afraid and, beginning to sink, cried out, "Lord, save me!"

³¹Immediately Jesus reached out his hand and caught him. "You of little faith," he said, "why did you doubt?"

³² And when they climbed into the boat, the wind died down.

³³ Then those who were in the boat worshiped him, saying, "Truly you are the Son of God."

Questions for Children about Jesus Walks on Water:

1. One thing people frequently miss about this story is its opening. How long was Jesus in prayer with God, according to verses 22-25? A: *Almost all night.* How do you think he and God communicated in these long sessions of prayer? Out loud? Did Jesus hear from God or just speak? Was it boring for Jesus? A: *He probably said what was truly in his heart; it probably wasn't out loud; it must have been pretty engaging for Jesus to not be bored.* What can we take away from this about our own prayer lives? A: Be sincere; be inquisitive; don't be afraid; truly listen for God's voice in response to your questions.

2. What did Peter ask Jesus? A: **To come to him.** According to verse 29 was he successful at first? A: **Yes.** What made Peter start to sink according to verse 30? He saw the wind; he focused on the circumstances. Think of a time you were really scared. When was it? Were you able to see through the circumstances and believe in God's power, or were you too busy focusing on the circumstances? How would you handle it differently next time?

3. The winds calmed as Jesus got into the boat. Why did God allow the winds that night in the first place? A: **Because he was about to show a miracle. Without the winds, the disciples would not have been so impressed.** God allows storms in our lives sometimes, meaning scary circumstances. What might this mean for us? **We could get a chance to see him work very powerfully. We should remember that when things get tough.**

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TEACHER'S MIGHTY MESSAGE

Peter's trip across the water to Jesus is a really popular miracle of Christ's. The reason is that it reflects our real lives so well. We often go through "storms" in life. Sometimes we have to move to a new community. Sometimes our parents can't get along and may even divorce. We've been bullied. We are afraid we will flunk a hard class. These storms don't involve thunder and lightning and strong winds. The involve our feelings of peace and security in the world.

We need God's help. Like Peter, we may ask for God's help with assurance. However, after we've taken a few steps or a few days have passed, we look at the bully, that tough assignment, that circumstance instead of God.


Peter didn't drown. And God never puts a circumstance before one of his children without providing that hand up, just like the hand that Jesus gave Peter. We have to listen for God's voice amidst all the clamor of life. Peter didn't drown in his circumstance, and neither will we.

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
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
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


2. FOLD the page 3 times along the gray lines. Now you can stand the paper up so that the water is on the bottom and the landscape + scripture prop the page up.

GAME

WALKING ON WATER

The Apostle Peter often gets a bum rap for having sunk, once he asked to come to Jesus on the water. We forget that Peter was the only disciple who even asked! This game will encourage kids to have some of Peter's faith — "walking on water" while blindfolded—which is about how Peter must have felt trying to reach the Lord in that dark, stormy night.



MATERIALS:

• Toilet paper (full rolls) or balled-up newspapers

- Pie tins
- Bandana
- Timer
- Masking tape



PREPARATION:

1. Lay down two strips of masking tape three feet apart, that run approximately eight feet in length.

2. Take 20 sheets of newspaper and ball them up into loose balls or take several rolls of toilet paper. Throw them in the area between the masking-tape lines, which is the "water."

OBJECTIVE

To get to Jesus with all this stuff going on around the blinded student, by listening for his voice.



INSTRUCTIONS:

1. Blindfold one student and have him take off his shoes, so that he is in his socks. Have him stand at the beginning of the playing field.

2. Place another student, who will be Jesus, at the other end.

3. Line other students up along the strips of masking tape, each with a pie tin.

- 4. Have the blindfolded student say, "May I come to you on the water?"
- 5. Have the Jesus student say, "Come to me!"
- 6.Have the assistant start your timer.

7. The blindfolded student should proceed toward Jesus, who can keep saying "Come to me!" No yelling! 8. The blinded student may not step directly on a ball newspaper or toilet paper or on the tape on either side. Directly means with more than half his foot. If he does, he has to start over.

9. Students along the side keep banging the pie tins.10. The blinded student must mind his feet, the toilet paper or newspapers, and the voice of the Lord to get to the end. As soon as the blinded student and Jesus join hands, their time is up.

11. The student who gets to the Lord first wins.

CONCLUSION:

Peter did not drown, though his circumstances were pretty terrifying. Neither will we—if we listen to God and learn how to tune out all the wind and rain in our lives.



Questions for Kids:

1. What was it that made Peter start to sink? *Fear*

2.What did Jesus want Peter to have more of? *Faith*

3. Was Peter ever in any danger? *No. Jesus was with him the entire time.*

Jesus wants us to have faith in him. Have you ever been in a situation that required faith? Tell the story? How did it work out? How did you feel?



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
