SCRIPTURE & LESSON

PASSAGES FROM (NIV): JOB 1 & 42

Read the following excerpts as shown (NIV translation), or read from your chosen Bible translation:



Job 1

- ¹ In the land of Uz there lived a man whose name was Job. This man was blameless and upright; he feared God and shunned evil. ² He had seven sons and three daughters, ³ and he owned seven thousand sheep, three thousand camels, five hundred yoke of oxen and five hundred donkeys, and had a large number of servants. He was the greatest man among all the people of the East.
- ⁴ His sons used to hold feasts in their homes on their birthdays, and they would invite their three sisters to eat and drink with them. ⁵ When a period of feasting had run its course, Job would make arrangements for them to be purified. Early in the morning he would sacrifice a burnt offering for each of them, thinking, "Perhaps my children have sinned and cursed God in their hearts." This was Job's regular custom.
- ⁶ One day the angels came to present themselves before the Lord, and Satan also came with them. ⁷ The Lord said to Satan, "Where have you come from?"

Satan answered the Lord, "From roaming throughout the earth, going back and forth on it."

- ⁸ Then the Lord said to Satan, "Have you considered my servant Job? There is no one on earth like him; he is blameless and upright, a man who fears God and shuns evil."
- ⁹ "Does Job fear God for nothing?" Satan replied. ¹⁰ "Have you not put a hedge around him and his household and everything he has? You have blessed the work of his hands, so that his flocks and herds are spread throughout the land. ¹¹ But now stretch out your hand and strike everything he has, and he will surely curse you to your face."
- ¹² The Lord said to Satan, "Very well, then, everything he has is in your power, but on the man himself do not lay a finger."

Then Satan went out from the presence of the Lord.

¹³ One day when Job's sons and daughters were feasting and drinking wine at the oldest brother's house, ¹⁴ a messenger came to Job and said, "The oxen were plowing and the donkeys were grazing nearby, ¹⁵ and the Sabeans attacked and made off with them. They put the servants to the sword, and I am the only one who has escaped to tell you!"



¹⁶ While he was still speaking, another messenger came and said, "The fire of God fell from the heavens and burned up the sheep and the servants, and I am the only one who has escaped to tell you!"

¹⁷ While he was still speaking, another messenger came and said, "The Chaldeans formed three raiding parties and swept down on your camels and made off with them. They put the servants to the sword, and I am the only one who has escaped to tell you!"

¹⁸ While he was still speaking, yet another messenger came and said, "Your sons and daughters were feasting and drinking wine at the oldest brother's house, ¹⁹ when suddenly a mighty wind swept in from the desert and struck the four corners of the house. It collapsed on them and they are dead, and I am the only one who has escaped to tell you!"

 20 At this, Job got up and tore his robe and shaved his head. Then he fell to the ground in worship 21 and said:

"Naked I came from my mother's womb,

and naked I will depart.

The Lord gave and the Lord has taken away;

may the name of the Lord be praised."

²² In all this, Job did not sin by charging God with wrongdoing.

Job 42:12-16

¹² The Lord blessed the latter part of Job's life more than the former part. He had fourteen thousand sheep, six thousand camels, a thousand yoke of oxen and a thousand donkeys. ¹³ And he also had seven sons and three daughters. ¹⁴ The first daughter he named Jemimah, the second Keziah and the third Keren-Happuch. ¹⁵ Nowhere in all the land were there found women as beautiful as Job's daughters, and their father granted them an inheritance along with their brothers.

¹⁶ After this, Job lived a hundred and forty years; he saw his children and their children to the fourth generation. 17 And so Job died, an old man and full of years.

Questions for Children about Job

- 1. See Verses 9-11. What did Satan accuse God of doing so that Job would always behave well? *Giving him protections and all sorts of blessings.* What did Satan say Job would do if all his blessings were taken away? *Curse God*
- 2. Why did God allow Job to be treated so badly? **To test his faith; to prove that he would not lose his faith under duress.** Think of some time when something bad happened in your life. How did you feel about God? Was your attitude as good as Job's was?
- 3. How did God reward Job for not giving into the temptation to curse God for his suffering? See Job 42 Verses 12-16. When we come under trial, what are some good things we can count on? **God will be with us, and God will eventually deliver us. We will get to meet him face to face in heaven.**



TEACHER'S MIGHTY MESSAGE

Job did nothing wrong. He didn't do anything to cause his own tragic circumstances. He had always been good. And when tragic circumstances came, he also didn't do anything wrong during that time.

One part of the story not covered in today's reading is that when Job had all his blessings taken and his skin had become so infected, three of his friends came over to "try to be helpful." They tried to get Job to say that he had done something wrong to bring about his hardship! They thought God was punishing Job for something and he ought to confess to what it was. They probably doubled his pain just from their accusations.

Oftentimes people suffer, and they did nothing to cause their own suffering. And yet some people—some Christians—think it is a time to stare and wonder what the person did. Perhaps nothing!

No matter what trials we go through in life, they will probably not be as bad as Job's. He shows us how to say, "blessed be the name of the Lord" no matter what is going on. This kind of behavior makes God incredibly happy.

God doesn't promise that our lives will always be rosy. He doesn't promise us that we won't be tested. He does promise that he loves us, and anything he allows to happen will eventually work toward our personal good and/or the good of others.





GAME

MEMORIZE SCRIPTURES FOR TRIALS

This game will give students four scriptures to commit to memory. They are considered favorites for people in times of trial. The repetitiveness in hearing and seeing will help them memorize them.



MATERIALS:

- Scripture cards (follow this lesson)
- Prizes (optional)

Preparation

Cut the strips according to the instructions on the game sheet and place them in a random pile on the table.

INTRODUCTION

Jesus did not promise to deliver us from any stress, pain, or heartache in this life. In fact, we often do our best growing while we are not comfortable. Stress and pain are part of growing up. Jesus said, "In this world, you will have tribulation. Be of good cheer; I have overcome the world." He also gave us some great comfort scriptures, and today we're going to learn four—in a fast and fun way!



INSTRUCTIONS:

- 1. Explain to students that they will have to put all the lines in order. They must figure out a strategy, because you will keep reading in an evenly paced way once they start.
- 2. Read through the four scriptures once, then have them "line" all four once with you. (Lining is where you say a line and they repeat it.)
- 3. Slowly, speak the lines of the scriptures one at a time.
- 4. The objective is for the students to get the lines in order.
- 5. Do not stop reading or slow down. You may suggest things at the top of the game like turn all the lines over first and make a separate place for the scripture verses.
- 6. If students have all the scripture lines in order by the sixth time you read them, everyone wins!

7. Ask individual students to recite each one. Give out prizes if you have them.



FAMOUS STORIES INCLUDED:

 The Book of Job is one story about a man who goes through extreme testing with the loss of his children, businesses, and eventually his own health.

MOST FAMOUS VERSES:

The Lord gave and the Lord has taken away; may the name of the Lord be praised." **Job 1:21**

His wife said to him, "Are you still maintaining your integrity? Curse God and die!" He replied, "You are talking like a foolish woman. Shall we accept good from God, and not trouble? *Job 2:9-10*

Important Points about the Book:

- Job's blessings are described in Chapter 1. Then his losses in the trial from Satan are described, ending in Chapter 2.
- In Chapters 3 through 37, Job converses with three friends who showed up. They want to make him feel better, but they confound their own efforts by accusing him of "earning" his trial by having sinned. Job has not sinned, and he refuses to say a bad word about God.
- In Chapters 37 through 40, God confronts them all, especially Job, with a strong speech on why they are not big enough or smart enough to question his acts.
- In the closing chapter, 41, God restores all of Job's losses, giving him twice as much as before and 10 more children.




