2) If for any reason a page is being cut off, when you push the "print" button and the dialogue box pops up, check the box "fit".

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
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#### How to Use the Lesson Kit:

**EXCERPTS OF GENESIS 6 THROUGH 9** 

Read the following excerpts as shown (NIV translation), or read Genesis 6-9 from your chosen Bible translation:



### **GENESIS 6**:

<sup>9</sup> Noah was a righteous man, blameless among the people of his time, and he walked faithfully with God.

<sup>12</sup> God saw how corrupt the earth had become, for all the people on earth had corrupted their ways.

<sup>13</sup> So God said to Noah, "I am going to put an end to all people, for the earth is filled with violence because of them.

<sup>14</sup> So make yourself an ark of cypress wood; make rooms in it and coat it with pitch inside and out.

<sup>15</sup> This is how you are to build it: The ark is to be three hundred cubits long, fifty cubits wide and thirty cubits high.

<sup>16</sup> Make a roof for it, leaving below the roof an opening one cubit high all around. Put a door in the side of the ark and make lower, middle and upper decks.

<sup>17</sup> I am going to bring floodwaters on the earth to destroy all life under the heavens, every creature that has the breath of life in it. Everything on earth will perish.

<sup>18</sup> But I will establish my covenant with you, and you will enter the ark—you and your sons and your wife and your sons' wives with you.

<sup>19</sup> You are to bring into the ark two of all living creatures, male and female, to keep them alive with you.

<sup>20</sup> Two of every kind of bird, of every kind of animal and of every kind of creature that moves along the ground will come to you to be kept alive.

<sup>21</sup> You are to take every kind of food that is to be eaten and store it away as food for you and for them."

<sup>22</sup> Noah did everything just as God commanded him.



#### **GENESIS 8**:

<sup>15</sup> Then God said to Noah,

<sup>16</sup> "Come out of the ark, you and your wife and your sons and their wives.

<sup>17</sup> Bring out every kind of living creature that is with you—the birds, the animals, and all the creatures that move along the ground—so they can multiply on the earth and be fruitful and increase in number on it."



#### **GENESIS 9**:

<sup>12</sup> And God said, "This is the sign of the covenant I am making between me and you and every living creature with you, a covenant for all generations to come:

<sup>13</sup> I have set my rainbow in the clouds, and it will be the sign of the covenant between me and the earth.

<sup>14</sup> Whenever I bring clouds over the earth and the rainbow appears in the clouds,

<sup>15</sup> I will remember my covenant between me and you and all living creatures of every kind.

### **Questions for Children about Noah's Ark:**

**1.** In Genesis 6:14-16, God gave Noah some really hefty instructions! Why did God want to help Noah so much?

#### A: Look at Genesis 9:6. It means that Noah always thought of God and wanted to make God happy by doing all the right things. How can we make God happy?

**2.** God gave Noah instructions. But Noah had to build that huge barge for the animals and people. What kept him from quitting?

A: Noah believed what God said. He wanted to make God happy. He was happy God wanted to save his whole family. If God told us to do something fantastic, how could we keep from quitting when the work got hard?

3. In Genesis 9:13, God shows Noah something beautiful. What was it?

A: A rainbow. It was a sign of God's promise that he would never entirely flood the earth again. Have you ever seen something in nature that was beautiful or amazing and thought God was trying to share a message with you? What was it?


### **TEACHER'S MIGHTY MESSAGE**

Color all of the pages.

















### GAME: HUMAN KNOT DETANGLE

This game will get kids in the mindset of people "living on top of each other," as was a likely feeling among Noah's family. It will drive sympathy and respect...and also provide a good lesson on focus and teamwork!

#### **Materials:**

None needed for this activity

#### Scripture:

And it came to pass in the six hundredth and first year, in the first month, the first day of the month, the waters were dried up from off the earth: and Noah removed the covering of the ark, and looked, and, behold, the face of the ground was dry. And in the second month, on the seven and twentieth day of the month, was the earth dried.

Genesis 8:13-14

#### Instructions:

1. Separate the children into two huddles.

2. Have all of them reach into the center of their respective circles and grab hands. (Each child should be holding hands with two different people.)

3. Their arms should be crisscrossed over each other and in a big "knot" in the center.


4. Now ask them to try and untangle themselves (so they are standing in a big wide circle) without letting go of each other's hands.

5. They may have to bend down, step over each other, or use other creative ways to untangle.

6. Set a timer for five to ten minutes. The first team to untangle wins—or the team that comes the closest by the time the buzzer goes off wins.

### CONCLUSION

We don't know what Noah and his family do on that boat for a year? We can only imagine! They probably told old family stories that would be important for future generations. They probably read copies of their written history that are thought to have been saved. But the same way you and your friends were just tangled up and close together, Noah's family probably felt like they living on top of each other! How would you get some space or make time fly if you were on the ark?

What doubters say: Ha ha ha ha! Noah's Ark could not have happened! How could Noah take millions of species onto one boat? Ha ha ha ha!

**Answer:** The Bible doesn't say Noah needed to take two of every species. Species is a modern word. Genesis says Noah took two of every "kind." What does "kind" mean?

*"Kind"* is usually translated to "family" in our animal classification system. Here is how the classification of animal life on our planet looks today:


Kingdom > Phylum > Class > Order > **Family** > Genus > Species

And Noah only had to take land-dwelling, air-breathing families on the ark (no fish). Including known extinct families, there are only about 1,400 kinds Noah had to take with him. Find all seven classification words in the word search above.

### This Week We Learned About ...

...Noah building an ark during the Great Flood. Noah kept following what God told him to do. He persisted in building the ark. He persisted, even though people probably laughed.

#### Questions for Kids:

1. See verse 11. What was the Covenant that God established with mankind? (A covenant is a promise that God will keep forever.) A: To never destroy the earth by water.

2. How do you think God felt about destroying the earth? How does his promise show how he felt? A: He felt really bad. You only promise to never do things again that make you feel awful.

3. Many Bible teachers say that if God had not destroyed all those violent and selfish people that they would have all destroyed each other within a hundred years. If they had done that, where would we be? We would never have been born. Jesus was born around 2,500 years later. Would Jesus have been able to come and be our Savior? No.

#### Dinner Table Discussion:

It is true that Noah didn't have to trap, catch or cajole any animals onto the ark. God sent them on there, just like he gets birds to fly south in winter. Noah watched in awe as a lot of animals came past! Which animals do you think were the most jaw-dropping for Noah to catch sight of? Why?

Put the story of Noah into modern times. What if God told you to build a rocket ship for you and your family because of a nuclear holocaust, would you do it? What do you think the neighbors would have to say about you?






