THE DOVE MIGHTY MESSAGES

This lesson on the origins of the dove symbol will give kids some background on the Holy Spirit and how we use the symbol today. Children will easily recognize the symbol, know its background, and may want to wear it or keep a likeness in their homes.

SCRIPTURE & LESSON

PASSAGE (NIV): VARIOUS PASSAGES ABOUT THE DOVE SYMBOL:

Read the following excerpts as shown (NIV translation), or read from your chosen Bible translation:



Matthew 3:16

As soon as Jesus was baptized, he went up out of the water. At that moment heaven was opened, and he saw the Spirit of God descending like a dove and alighting on him.

Matthew 10:16

I am sending you out like sheep among wolves. Therefore be as shrewd as snakes and as innocent as doves.

Genesis 8:6-12

⁶ After forty days Noah opened a window he had made in the ark ⁷ and sent out a raven, and it kept flying back and forth until the water had dried up from the earth. ⁸ Then he sent out a dove to see if the water had receded from the surface of the ground. ⁹ But the dove could find nowhere to perch because there was water over all the surface of the earth; so it returned to Noah in the ark. He reached out his hand and took the dove and brought it back to himself in the ark. ¹⁰ He waited seven more days and again sent out the dove from the ark. ¹¹ When the dove returned to him in the evening, there in its beak was a freshly plucked olive leaf! Then Noah knew that the water had receded from the earth. ¹² He waited seven more days and sent the dove out again, but this time it did not return to him.

Questions for Children

- 1. In the first verse, a dove descended upon Jesus at his baptism. What did it symbolize? The Spirit of God. The Spirit of God is another name for which Spirit? The Holy Spirit.
- 2. Jesus uses two metaphors in the second verse from Matthew. First, he says he is sending his disciples out a sheep among wolves. Have you ever felt when you were with a group of children that you were a sheep among wolves? What does that mean? Take answers. Being a sheep among wolves means you feel like you are the only person in the crowd who feels bad about something wrong or wants to do right when everyone is doing wrong.
- 3. The last scripture from Genesis is much older. The story of Noah and the Ark happened around 2500 BC. Noah and his family were the only people left alive on the planet. What was Noah relying on the dove to do? Find land, or in other words, find that life was sustainable in a very dead world. How does the Holy Spirit help us find life in a very dark world? It gives us power to follow Jesus and it leads us to eternal life above.



TEACHER'S MIGHTY MESSAGE

Throughout your message, keep visible a copy of your coloring sheet, containing the Dove symbol, which you can point to.

The four gospels are Matthew, Mark, Luke, and John. The gospels tell the life of Jesus. But often the authors chose different stories to tell. It is rare that one story is in all four gospels. Not even the Christmas story is in all four gospels! However, this story about the dove descending on Jesus is in all four gospels: (Matthew 3:16; Mark 1:10; Luke 3:22; John 1:32).

The dove symbolizes the Holy Spirit, thanks to these accounts of Jesus' baptism. It seemed to be a time when the divine side of Jesus came into its full power, like a car engine turning on. Before this, Jesus was a very well-behaved boy and man whom everyone got along with. After the dove descended as the Holy Spirit, Jesus went off into the wilderness for 40 days, was tempted by Satan, and then started performing miracles and teaching.

The dove symbolizes purity and harmlessness. At Jesus' baptism, the dove symbolized his holiness and innocence. We all want to follow God as Jesus did, which will keep us pure, harmless, holy and innocent.

The story of Noah is a foreshadowing of the story of Jesus. Who knows what a foreshadowing is? It's something that happens first that points to a bigger event coming in the future. Noah used the dove to find if the earth could sustain life. Jesus received the dove to show us life eternal. Noah's world got very messed up again, and by the time Jesus came 2,500 years later, it was a difficult and shadowy place. Today, we have our problems as well—violence, poverty, famine, plagues, greed, sin, crime, and bad choices made all around us.

This is why some people wear the dove of peace around their necks. They wear it a sign that they, too, have received the Holy Spirit, and God is guiding them. People have copies on their wall, or especially over doorways, to symbolize their belief that the Holy Spirit is present in their dwelling places.

Where have you seen a dove of peace? People wearing one? In someone's home? On a Bible cover? Where would you like to see one in your house? Wear it...in my room, etc.



PRINTABLE CRAFT

Students can make these hanging doves for a doorway or a lamp to symbolize peace in their dwellings. Card stock or scrapbooking sheets can make them longer lasting!



MATERIALS:

- Paper Dove Printable Craft Template (follows)
- White Paper
- Coloring Utensils
- Scissors
- Glue Stick



PREPARATION:

• Print out a copy of the printable craft for each student

INSTRUCTIONS:

- 1. Color images as desired
- 2. Cut out Dove Pieces
- 3. Glue Dove Tail on top of Dove Body, matching up angled ends
- 4. Glue Dove wings on top of Dove body covering tab from Dove Tail
- 5. Fold Dove body slightly and glue Dove body pieces together.


Introduction or Conclusion























WORD SEARCH


