### THE FLAME MIGHTY MESSAGES

This lesson on the origins of the candle or flame symbol shows how these symbols have become endearing to Christians over the centuries. Students will learn to think of prayers going up when they see a candle flame, and to see it as a sign of a loving, listening God.

### **SCRIPTURE & LESSON**

PASSAGE (NIV): VARIOUS PASSAGES ABOUT THE SYMBOL

Read the following excerpts as shown (NIV translation), or read from your chosen Bible translation:



### **Revelation 8:3-4**

<sup>3</sup> Another angel, who had a golden censer, came and stood at the altar. He was given much incense to offer, with the prayers of all God's people, on the golden altar in front of the throne. <sup>4</sup> The smoke of the incense, together with the prayers of God's people, went up before God from the angel's hand.

### **Revelation 5:8**

And when he had taken it, the four living creatures and the twenty-four elders fell down before the Lamb. Each one had a harp and they were holding golden bowls full of incense, which are the prayers of God's people.

### Psalm 141:2

May my prayer be set before you like incense; may the lifting up of my hands be like the evening sacrifice.

### Psalm 18:28

You, LORD, keep my lamp burning;

my God turns my darkness into light.

### **Questions for Children**

- 1. In the first two passages from Revelation, prayers of God's people are compared to smoke or incense. In fact, the second one states that prayers turn into something physical in heaven. Energy of prayer becomes mass in heaven! Prayers become smoking incense. How would it change your prayers if you pictured them as being something like smoke and incense when they come before God? Take answers.
- 2. Incense is often lit with a flame or kept lit by burning embers. The writer of Psalm 141 presents his prayer as being like incense. The verse was written at least a thousand years before the passages in the Revelation. What does this tell you about the practice of associating prayer with candles? It is very old in the Judeo-Christian faith. If prayers have energy, how should you pray? Like your prayers are real and meaningful to God. Try to feel them as you want God to feel them.
- 3. A flame sometimes symbolizes an actual connection between us and God. Why do you think many adults around the world feel inclined to light candles when they pray? It makes them feel closer to God; it gives them a sense of assurance that he will hear and respond; it is a universal way of saying that you really want God's attention to a matter.



### TEACHER'S MIGHTY MESSAGE

Throughout your message, keep visible a copy of your coloring sheet, containing the symbol, which you can point to.

Children are often forbidden to use candles when praying due to the threat of fire. However, many adults are drawn to the idea of lighting candles when they pray.

In some churches, especially Catholic ones, there is a special place to light candles for a person or issue that is really on your heart. You light a candle, then say your prayer.

In many churches, candles are lit during Christmas Eve "candlelight services." They signify Jesus being the light of the world while coming in such a humble way. A flame is a humble fire; it's not the type where you need to call the fire department or that gets out of control.

For centuries, people have lit candles to celebrate the light of Christ as well as the power of prayer. The flame symbolizes light in the darkness, which is what the Bible says that Jesus is.

Nearly ALL religions rely on flame or candlelight or incense to increase a spiritual feeling. In the Jewish faith, a famous use of candlelight is with the menorah, which holds eight candles, to celebrate Hanukkah. A clay lamp, or a diya, is a traditional a part of every Hindu ritual. In Buddhism, candles are placed in front of Buddhist shrines or statues, which symbolize his teachings.

It could therefore be said that God puts the idea of candles in worship in everyone's hearts. If prayers turn to candle-like structures in heaven, it's no wonder they seem so useful down here.

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### PRINTABLE CRAFT



### **MATERIALS:**

- Paper Candle Printable Craft (one page)
- White Paper or Cardstock
- Scissors
- Glue



### PREPARATION:

• Print one copy of Paper Candle Craft for each student

### **INSTRUCTIONS:**

- 1. Color images as desired
- 2. Carefully cut out shapes, including slits in the large rectangle
- 3. Starting with circle flame shapes, glue circles on top of each other stacking from largest to smallest
- 4. Glue Candle to form cylinder.
- 5. Insert flame shape through slits in the back
- 6. Glue scripture to the front of the candle

### **Introduction or Conclusion**

Take your candle home and put it on your nightstand. When you say a prayer, think of the flame being the energy that reaches up to God. Believe your prayer has been heard by our living God!









