SCRIPTURE & LESSON

PASSAGE (NIV): LUKE 1:26-38

Read the following excerpts as shown (NIV translation), or read from your chosen Bible translation:



Luke 1:26-38

God sent the angel Gabriel to Nazareth, a town in Galilee, to a virgin pledged to be married to a man named Joseph, a descendant of David. The virgin's name was Mary. The angel went to her and said, "Greetings, you who are highly favored! The Lord is with you."

Mary was greatly troubled at his words and wondered what kind of greeting this might be. But the angel said to her, "Do not be afraid, Mary; you have found favor with God. You will conceive and give birth to a son, and you are to call him Jesus. He will be great and will be called the Son of the Most High. The Lord God will give him the throne of his father David, and he will reign over Jacob's descendants forever; his kingdom will never end."

"How will this be," Mary asked the angel, "since I am a virgin?"

The angel answered, "The Holy Spirit will come on you, and the power of the Most High will overshadow you. So the holy one to be born will be called the Son of God. Even Elizabeth your relative is going to have a child in her old age, and she who was said to be unable to conceive is in her sixth month. For no word from God will ever fail."

"I am the Lord's servant," Mary answered. "May your word to me be fulfilled." Then the angel left her."

Questions for Children

- 1. In Verse 29, Mary is described as "greatly troubled" at seeing the angel Gabriel. Why do you think she was troubled? How would you feel if an angel showed up to speak to you?
- 2. The angel Gabriel told Mary she would be the mother of the Son of God in Verse 35. Based on what he said, the baby would likely cause people to think ill of her. Unmarried women who became pregnant were considered immoral and bad people. She would have done nothing wrong. Her baby would be conceived by the Holy Spirit, not a man. Her reply was, "I am the Lord's servant...may your work to me by fulfilled." If God were to see an angel who told us things that made us anxious, how should we respond? How would you have responded if you were in Mary's shoes?
- 3. Let's look at Mary's life: Mary was said in Verse 26 to be from Nazareth in the region of Galilee. While we wouldn't call this a slum, it was a working-class neighborhood without rich people, much grace, much of anything that was pretty or shiny and clean. What does it tell you about God, that he would pick a place like this to have his only begotten son born into? How should you feel about people who are from neighborhoods that are not as clean and pretty as your own?



TEACHER'S MIGHTY MESSAGE

Mary may have seemed to others like just another girl in another hard-hit neighborhood. She wasn't rich. She was probably not stunningly beautiful. She didn't stand out. There is good news in all of this.

First, it shows how God does not often pick the rich and beautiful to do his will. The first king of Israel, King Saul, was said to have been a very handsome man. But God knew that people needed to listen to their king, and they would be more likely to do that if this king looked really good. King Saul was also from the tribe of Benjamin, considered the very smallest and least likely tribe to be noticed.

King David was said to be very handsome. But he had seven older brothers, who in the military who were even handsomer. And after the prophet Samuel anointed him as king, he had to run and hide in caves for 13 or more years, while the current king sought to kill him.

God tends to use people who are humble. Mary came from a very humble place. And her answer to the angel of "yes sir, whatever you say" showed her humble nature.

Are you trying for greatness? Practice humility. Are you trying for wealth? Try instead for godliness. Are you trying for importance? Be the biggest, best servant of all. This is the way the people of the Bible achieved status as God's heroes on earth, and Jesus' mother Mary is a great example of that.





PRINTABLE CRAFT



MATERIALS:

- Mary and Gabriel Printable File (three pages)
- White and Pastel Colored Paper (we recommend paper instead of cardstock because it is easier to fold)
- Coloring Utensils
- Scissors
- Glue
- Tape
- Hole Punch
- String
- Piper Cleaner (optional)
- Glitter glue (optional)



PREPARATION:

- Print one copy of Mary and Angel Gabriel Printable Craft for each student, making sure that there two pages of Angel Gabriel page so each student with have four pages total
- We recommend printing Mary page on pastel colored paper

INSTRUCTIONS:

- 1. Color Faces and Halo Strip as desired
- 2. Carefully cut out three Faces and Halo Strip, and cut half sheet along dotted line, keeping half page with fold lines to create Baby Jesus.
- 3. For ALL remaining pages (half sheet for baby Jesus, Mary Page, and two Angel pages): Flip paper over, images side down, and fold back on first line. Following line guides, fold accordion style, alternating each fold. Carefully trim any length that overhangs.

FOR BABY JESUS: (HALF SHEET)

- Bend folded paper to find the middle point
- Glue head tab to middle point, making sure the face lines up with the edge
- Glue outside edges where indicate on the last fold and press together to form the body in a fan shape.
- Carefully gather the folds and tie a length of string loosely around folds to keep together.

CUT AND COLOR ALL













FOR MARY: (ONE COLORED FULL SHEET)

- find hole punch guide on last fold and carefully punch a hole where indicated. Cut a length of string for hanging and feed ends through hole, taping to secure.
- Refold along lines, and follow the same directions as Baby Jesus for attaching head and gluing folds together to form body.
- Gather folds and loosely wrap string around to secure. Before tying off, slip one side of string through the strings on the back of the Baby Jesus to attach and then tie together.
- Fan out body of Mary underneath the tie.











FOR ANGEL GABRIEL: (TWO FULL SHEETS)

- With fold gathered together in a strip, fold strip where indicated so that each piece has a short and long side. Repeat for other page
- Glue short side to long side and press together to form wing and half of body. Repeat for other sheet of paper
- Cut a length of string for hanging, and glue one string end to folded sheet on the long side of the fold (the middle of the body). Repeat for other side, then glue long sides of fold of the two pieces together to form complete body. There should now be a loop at the top for hanging.
- Tape Angel head to one side of the string
- Glue halo strip together and then tape to string, OR alternatively, use optional pipe cleaner to form halo
- Optional: Decorate Angel with glitter glue and let dry





GAME

MOTHER MARY, MAY I PLEASE...

This game, the inverse version of Mother, May I, will have children reflecting on some of the challenges of faith while trying to do the opposite of what you say.



Instructions:

- 1. Clear a large-enough playing area where children can spread out in a line and move forward or backward several giant steps.
- 2. Have the children form a line across the playing area, with social distancing space between them if needed.
- 3. Like in the game Mother, May I, children will have to respond to your requests of "take two giant steps forward" or "take one baby step forward," remembering to say "Mother Mary, May I Please?" If they fail to remember to say it, they must go back to the starting line.
- 4. HOWEVER, in this game they must remember to do the OPPOSITE of what you say and not the thing you say. If you say to take three baby steps forward, they must take three baby steps backward. If you say take a giant step forward, they must take a giant step backward.
- 5. The person who gets to the finish line first wins.

Conclusion:

You had to remember two things: To say "Mother Mary, May I Please," and to go in the opposite direction that I said. It's a little like Jesus' mother Mary, having to remember the things the angel Gabriel told her and not to be upset by any of it. It was very special that God spoke, and even though it was difficult, she responded in all the right ways. Let's try to remember to respond to God's calls to us-even when it seems a bit confusing or hard!





✓ Questions for Kids:


