

EXCERPTS FROM THE BOOK OF LUKE (NIV)

Read the following excerpts as shown (NIV translation), or read from your chosen Bible translation:



LUKE 2:

¹In those days Caesar Augustus issued a decree that a census should be taken of the entire Roman world.

³ And everyone went to their own town to register.

⁴ So Joseph also went up from the town of Nazareth in Galilee to Judea, to Bethlehem the town of David, because he belonged to the house and line of David.

⁵ He went there to register with Mary, who was pledged to be married to him and was expecting a child.

⁶ While they were there, the time came for the baby to be born,

⁷ and she gave birth to her firstborn, a son. She wrapped him in cloths and placed him in a manger, because there was no guest room available for them.

⁸ And there were shepherds living out in the fields nearby, keeping watch over their flocks at night.

⁹ An angel of the Lord appeared to them, and the glory of the Lord shone around them, and they were terrified.

¹⁰ But the angel said to them, "Do not be afraid. I bring you good news that will cause great joy for all the people.

¹¹ Today in the town of David a Savior has been born to you; he is the Messiah, the Lord. ¹² This will be a sign to you: You will find a baby wrapped in cloths and lying in a manger."

¹³ Suddenly a great company of the heavenly host appeared with the angel, praising God and saying,

¹⁴ "Glory to God in the highest heaven, and on earth peace to those on whom his favor rests."

¹⁵ When the angels had left them and gone into heaven, the shepherds said to one another, "Let's go to Bethlehem and see this thing that has happened, which the Lord has told us about."

¹⁶ So they hurried off and found Mary and Joseph, and the baby, who was lying in the manger.

¹⁷ When they had seen him, they spread the word concerning what had been told them about this child,

¹⁸ and all who heard it were amazed at what the shepherds said to them.

¹⁹ But Mary treasured up all these things and pondered them in her heart.

²⁰ The shepherds returned, glorifying and praising God for all the things they had heard and seen, which were just as they had been told.

Questions for Children about the Birth of Jesus:

1. A manger is a feeding trough for animals, typically found in a barn or stable. Why do you think God had his Son born in a manger instead of a palace or a castle? *A: God wanted to set an example for us that the big-ticket items of this world don't mean anything to him and shouldn't mean anything to us.* What does the manger birth tell you about how humble Jesus' life would be?

2. Should you be ashamed if your family doesn't have a lot of money, or not as much as others you know? Why or why not?

3. When kids start demanding big or expensive Christmas or birthday presents, why should you be different? What can you do to assure that you don't get caught up in material desires?

TEACHER'S MIGHTY MESSAGE

Jesus' birth was a very humble birth. Jesus' parents, Mary and Joseph, had to take a long journey on dusty, cold roads by foot or on mules. There was no fancy parade to bring them to Bethlehem.

There was no grand hotel where they had the royal suite. The people whom God told about the birth of the Messiah? Shepherds. They are like today's versions of auto mechanics or factory workers. Their hands were rough, their clothes needed to be washed. People tended to value them less than governors or priests or rabbis. But God doesn't.

Jesus was born into humility. His birth was humble. To be humble or have humility means you don't need to show off. You already know who you are. To show humility means you already know that the treasures of this world grow boring fast, and they don't make people happy. To be humble means you are ready for God to do great things with you. That humility always precedes God's greatness. Therefore, we should be thankful and hopeful when we see humble circumstances in our lives.

We will get to be exalted by God in his right time. If it isn't now, be thankful that your humility makes you a lot like Jesus at his birth.



PRINTABLE CRAFT

NATIVITY ORNAMENTS



MATERIALS:

- White paper or card stock
- Coloring utensils
- Scissors
- Glue stick
- Decorative yarn or cord







- 2. Color as desired.
- 3. Cut out the individual pieces.
- 4. Fold the tab on the body of the ornament, then straighten. Set aside.
- 5. Cut a length of decorative yarn or cord, 8-10" length. Bring the ends together and knot so that it forms a loop.
- 6. Place the loop on the underside of the body of the ornament, so that the loop points out the top and the knot is about an inch from the edge. Secure with glue or tape.
- 7. Apply glue to the tab on the body of ornament, then wrap into a cone shape, pressing the tab to the underside to secure. *Note: It is okay if the top doesn't perfectly match up. There needs to be a little room for the loop and the backside won't show once the ornaments are hung.*
- 8. Fold the arm pieces along the fold line.
- 9. Apply glue to the ends of the arms and secure to the body of the ornament, over the marked dots.
- 10. Apply glue to the ends of the leg pieces and secure to the underside of the body of the ornament so that the marked lines are just hid.
- 11. Apply any other pieces for the completion of the ornament:
 - Wings to Angel.
 - Gifts to Wise Men.
- 12. Hang up your beautiful Nativity Ornaments!


























GAME

NATIVITY BALLOON POP

This game will help students begin to understand how the Nativity message and the humble birth of Christ can be missed with all the world's distractions.

OBJECTIVE

Pop the balloons to find all of the pieces of the Nativity scene and put them in order in three minutes.



MATERIALS:

- Post-It notes
- Markers
- 20 balloons
- Trash bag, large enough to hold 20 blown-up balloons
- Piece of paper and pen
- Chair



PREPARATION:

1. Using the following list and Post-It notes, write out one item from the Nativity on each of 10 Post-Its.

- Baby Jesus
- Mary
- Joseph
- Angel
- Star
- Three Kings
- Camel
- Manger
- Sheep
- Donkey

2. Blow up 20 balloons and stick one Post-It note in 10 of them. The other 10 will be empty. Mix them together and place them in a garbage bag in the play area.

- 3. Make a copy of the master list of 10 items and place it in the middle of the table.
- 4. Place a child's chair at the far end of the play area next to the chair.



GAME CONINUED

INTRODUCTION

There's something inside these balloons. Well, in some of them. But you're not going to have a whole lot of time to shake, examine, or pick balloons. Run up, grab a balloon, sit on it, POP it, and see what flies out! You'll get the idea of what we're looking for as you proceed.

INSTRUCTIONS

- 1. Have students form a line.
- 2. When you say "Go!" to the first person, she will run to the chair, pick out a balloon, and sit on it until it pops. She should bring the broken balloon back to the table.
- **3.** Let the other students prompt her if she misses a Post-It note. She should bring that back with her also.
- 4. Once she gets to the table, she should put the broken balloon in a discard pile and any Post-It note in order on the table to match the master list. Tell each student as they approach what they are to do with the Post-It.
- 5. Repeat until all balloons are broken, all items are retrieved, and the list of Post-Its is in the same order as the master list.


CLOSING:

There was a lot of banging going on, wasn't there? There was a lot of confusion. It's a little like the Christmas season. There's so much banging around—shopping and baking and eating and drinking and tearing at wrapping paper! It's easy to miss the birth of Jesus, which is a little like these Nativity Post-It notes. You had to look for them, just like we have to look for the meaning of the birth of Jesus.

And all those big, shiny presents? They're a lot like these balloons (point to the pile of discarded and broken balloons). They're fun for a moment or two, and then they're discarded.





PARENT HANDOUT

Scriptures to Read: Luke 2:4-14

This Week We Learned About ...

Jesus was born under very special circumstances. First an angel came to tell Mary she was going to have a baby. Then Jesus' parents had to go on a long journey. When Mary went into labor they were forced to stop, but the inn was full. Jesus had to be born in the stable with the animals!

The birth of Jesus teaches us that Jesus didn't need to flaunt his power. By being born in such a humble way we see that he can relate to everyone—even the lowest among us.

Questions for Kids:

1. Mary and Joseph lived in a very dusty working class village without much wealth. Some people compare it to today's Detroit. What was it called? **Nazareth in Galilee**

2. How did the shepherds respond when they saw the host of angels? *Terror*

3. Why did Mary have to give birth in the stable? *There wasn't any room in the inn.*

Dinner Table Discussion:

Jesus wasn't born in a fancy hospital, or given lots of toys and clothes on his birthday. The teaches us that money and possessions aren't very important to God. What are some things that do matter a lot to God?

Even though God knew how things would turn out, Mary and Joseph were probably worried at different points in their journey. How do you feel when you aren't sure how things will turn out? Can you tell a story about a time you felt that way?






